



SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Be alert and aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Actively observe for anomalies by not listening to headphones or being distracted by your phone.
- Know the FPCON levels at all times and what this means for your posture.
- Vary your routines, alter your routes, and avoid frequenting the same establishments.

PRACTICE COUNTER SURVEILLANCE

- You are a potential target.
- Recognize and report indicators of surveillance.
- This includes individuals tracking your movements, taking photos of base access points, attempting to pace your vehicle, or asking probing questions about your unit or mission.
- Report any of these activities immediately.

REPORTING

- If you see something suspicious, you have a duty to report it.
- DO NOT assume someone else will.
- Report to your chain of command unit, appropriate law enforcement, counterintelligence authority, or the installation Provost Marshal's Office.

MAINTAIN A LOW PROFILE

At all times, you are both an ambassador and a potential target; blend in and avoid drawing attention to yourself or your military affiliation.

STRONGLY RECOMMEND not wearing your military uniform or military-themed clothing to and from base or outside of official duties.

Remove or avoid vehicle decals that could identify you as a service member.
